

Photo Prawing Makeover

Creative Station:

Find images in magazine pictures and try drawing them. Remember that you are looking for shapes and lines in relationship to each other. Listen to your eyes.



The next level of difficulty is drawing from real life. Now you need to look at an object in all of its **three dimensions** (height, width and depth) and try to record what you see on paper. It can be confusing.

Take a photo of what you want to draw and then draw by looking at the photo. This helps you see the relationships between spaces and where on the page each part fits.





Drawing grid lines on your photo and on your drawing paper helps you see where to locate each part of the picture.



You may even want to turn your photo and your drawing paper upside down. This helps your eye focus on shapes instead of sending messages to your brain to identify the thing you are drawing.
