Grayson County 4-H and the \_\_\_\_\_ 4-H Club/Project Group are excited to have your family participated in a variety of fun educational programs during the 2020-2021 4-H year!

In order to do our best to engage all families, the Grayson County 4-H Program may look a little different than in previous years. The health and safety of all 4-H members, volunteers, parents, guests, and staff is the top priority of Texas 4-H and Texas A&M AgriLife Extension. The purpose of this letter is to help reduce the risks associated with the spread of COVID-19 and to ensure you that we are taking steps to reduce the spread, while providing fun educational programs for youth in Grayson County.

**The following guidelines from the Texas Department of Health & Environment and the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and Texas A&M AgriLife Extension should be followed to protect yourself and others during 4-H Club meetings and other 4-H programs.**

1. Stay home when sick and avoid contact with other people unless you need medical
2. Follow common-sense steps such as washing your hands often and well; covering your coughs and sneezes; and cleaning and if soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol
3. Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed
4. Avoid close contact with people by staying at least 6 feet
5. Wear cloth face coverings in public settings where social distancing is difficult to
6. Wipe down all common surfaces as recommended by the Center for Disease Control (CDC). Common surfaces include tables, counters, doorknobs, light switches, counter tops, handles, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, chairs, etc.

All 4-H family members planning to attend a Texas 4-H function will need to submit their **Covid19 Screening Form** prior to or at check-in of the 4-H meeting or activity they will be attending. This form can be found at <https://grayson.agrilife.org/4hpreparedness>. 4-H Club Managers and Project Leaders should have a copy of the form available at the check-in area.

It is important for 4-H families to check with their 4-H Club Manager or Project Leader to confirm if an educational program will be held in-person or through a virtual platform.
